## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAMS FOR ADULTS 2010-2011

We offer a wide range of workshops and classes for adults, generally offered on weekends and weekday evenings. Our adult offerings focus on personal spirituality, Unitarian Universalist history and theology, social justice issues, and world religions.

All programs are also open to teenagers unless otherwise noted. *Please note:* If you are under 18, participating in programs that meet any time other than Sunday morning requires us to have a parent or guardian's written permission and your emergency information. If needed, please feel free to discuss this issue in confidence with our minister, the Reverend Laura Horton-Ludwig.

This year's course offerings include:

### ANTI-RACISM FILM SERIES

September–November, dates vary (see below). All screenings take place at 6:30 at the church.

This five-session film/discussion series, open to the community, will challenge us to confront white privilege and the legacy of racism in our society and our Unitarian Universalist faith:

#### Saturday, September 18:

*Tim Wise: On White Privilege.* White anti-racist Tim Wise offers an inside-out view of race, racism, and the cost to all.

#### Saturday, October 2:

*Mirrors of Privilege: Making Whiteness Visible.* Oakland filmmaker Shakti Butler has created this powerful film featuring the experiences of white men and women who have worked to gain insight into what it means to challenge notions of racism and white supremacy.

#### Monday, October 18:

*Race: The Power of an Illusion*, part 1. This PBS documentary asks: What is this thing called “race?” and reveals most of our common assumptions about race are wrong.

#### Saturday, November 6:

*Wilderness Journey: The Struggle for Black Empowerment and Racial Justice within the Unitarian Universalist Association, 1967-1970.* Features interviews with many UU leaders who lived through those complex times.

#### Monday, November 29:

*Building the Beloved Community: How Do We Talk about Racism and Clas-*

*sism?* Features UU voices plus speakers from Class Action, a nonprofit organization working to end classism, and scholar-activist Dr. Vincent Harding.
